ABSTRACT

This collection consists of the papers of the Nichols family of Boston, specifically those of Arthur Howard Nichols (1840-1923), his daughter Rose Standish Nichols (1872-1960), and other family members. Included are family correspondence, diaries and other personal papers, financial and professional papers, and printed matter.

BIOGRAPHICAL NOTE

Below are brief biographical sketches of the Nichols family members represented in this collection, arranged by date of birth.

John Perkins Nichols (1798-1891)

Born in Amherst, New Hampshire, to Timothy Nichols III and Susannah (Towne) Nichols. Moved to Boston in 1828 and married Mary Ann Clarke in 1831. Worked as a cabinet-maker and co-owned a granite quarry in Concord, New Hampshire. Had three sons, but only one, Arthur Howard Nichols, lived past childhood.

Charles Nichols (1808-1885)

Born in Amherst, New Hampshire, to Timothy Nichols III and Susannah (Towne) Nichols. As a young man, trained and worked painting, chair-making and cabinet-making. Relocated to Boston in 1827 and worked in several daguerreotype galleries. Gave up work in 1856 and devoted the remainder of his life to religious study and missionary work, living with his brother John Perkins Nichols.

Mary Ann (Clarke) Nichols (1810-1885)

Born in Wilton, New Hampshire to David Ramsey Clarke and Anna Spaulding (Fiske) Clarke. Married John Perkins Nichols in 1831. Mother of Arthur Howard Nichols and to two other children, George Perkins Nichols and Alfred Adams Nichols, who died in childhood.

Arthur Howard Nichols (1840-1923)

Born in Boston to John Perkins Nichols and Mary Ann (Clarke) Nichols. Attended the Endicott School, the Boston Latin School, Harvard College (class of 1862), and Harvard Medical School (class of 1866). Studied in Europe in 1863 and 1866-1868. Married Elizabeth Fisher Homer in November 1869. Had three daughters, Rose Standish, Marian Clarke, and Margaret Homer and a son, Sidney Homer, who died in childhood (1876-1881). Practiced medicine in Boston from 1868 until his death. Lived and worked at 55 Mount Vernon Street, Boston, from 1885. Was a devotee and scholar of hand bells and tower bells, publishing four monographs on the subject.

Elizabeth Fisher (Homer) Nichols (1844-1929)

Born in Roxbury, Massachusetts, to Thomas Johnston Homer and Mary Elizabeth (Fisher) Homer. Attended private schools in Boston. Married Arthur Howard Nichols in November 1869. Had three daughters, Rose Standish, Marian Clarke, and

Margaret Homer and a son, Sidney Homer, who died in childhood (1876-1881). Died at her country home in Cornish, New Hampshire, in September 1929.

Rose Standish Nichols (1872-1960)

Born in Boston to Arthur Howard Nichols and Elizabeth Fisher (Homer) Nichols. A pioneering woman in the profession of landscape and garden design. Published three books on European garden design. Helped found the Woman's International League for Peace and Freedom and active in the women's rights movement, the peace movement, and other progressive causes of the early 20th century. Served as the Boston area agent for the sculptor Augustus Saint-Gaudens, who was married to her maternal aunt, Augusta (Homer) Saint-Gaudens. Lived in the Nichols family home at 55 Mount Vernon Street, Boston, from 1885 until her death in 1960. Bequeathed the home to a trust to operate as a house museum. The Nichols House Museum, Inc. has been open to the public since 1961.

Marian Clarke Nichols (1873-1963)

Born in Boston to Arthur Howard Nichols and Elizabeth Fisher (Homer) Nichols. Educated at Radcliffe College (class of 1899). A prominent activist and government reformer. Served as executive secretary of the Women's Auxiliary of the Massachusetts Civil Service Reform Association from 1903-1963; was the first female member of the National Civil Service Reform League; served as chairwoman of the legislative committee of the Boston League of Women Voters; and was executive secretary of the Beacon Hill Association for seventeen years.

Margaret Homer (Nichols) Shurcliff (1879-1959)

Born in Boston to Arthur Howard Nichols and Elizabeth Fisher (Homer) Nichols. Married Arthur Asahel Shurtleff (spelled Shurcliff after 1930) in 1905. Had six children, Sidney Nichols Shurcliff, Sarah Parsons Shurcliff (later Ingelfinger), William Asahel Shurcliff, John Perkins Shurcliff, Elizabeth Homer Shurcliff (later Lowell), and Alice Warburton Shurcliff. Was an accomplished carpenter. Shared her father's hobby of hand bell ringing.

SCOPE AND CONTENT NOTE

The papers of the Nichols family of Boston, Massachusetts, consist of six linear feet of correspondence, diaries, financial records, and printed matter spanning the years 1806-1960, with the majority of the material falling between 1850 and 1960. The primary authors are Arthur Howard Nichols, his daughter Rose Standish Nichols, as well as other members of their family. The collection offers an in-depth look at the personal, financial, and professional lives of the Nichols family.

A significant element of the collection is the correspondence, arranged in Series I. Many of the earliest letters, from Arthur Howard Nichols to his mother, Mary Ann (Clarke) Nichols, offer a detailed account of Arthur's life as a student during the 1850s and 1860s. The late nineteenth and early twentieth century correspondence is also mainly Arthur Howard Nichols,' though the focus turns to his professional life and other interests. The later correspondence is mostly between the other members of the Nichols family, including Elizabeth Fisher (Homer) Nichols and her daughters, Rose Standish Nichols, Marian Clarke Nichols, and Margaret Homer (Nichols) Shurcliff. The Nichols family arranged some correspondence by subject (preserved in Subseries B) and Rose Standish Nichols arranged some of her most important correspondence alphabetically (preserved in Subseries C). Rose's alphabetical correspondence consists of small numbers of letters from activists, politicians, writers, artists, and other distinguished individuals.

The largest segment of the collection is the financial and legal papers, arranged in Series II. The bulk of the series are financial records, particularly those of Arthur Howard Nichols and Rose Standish Nichols. Rose Standish Nichols' financial records date from 1938-1959 and are detailed and voluminous. Arthur Howard Nichols' financial papers include both personal and professional records. The professional financial records often include medical information on his patients, offering revealing documentation of the practice of medicine in Boston in the late nineteenth and early twentieth centuries. Arthur's notes on medical cases threatening litigation, which appears in Series III, complement these records.

The diaries and notebooks, arranged in Series III, offer a more personal perspective on the family, particularly Elizabeth Fisher (Homer) Nichols. Elizabeth's two diaries offer two very different windows into her life: one is a detailed girlhood diary written between 1857-1858, while the other she began at the time of her husband's death in 1923, chronicling her life as a widow. The diaries and notebooks also offer a detailed view of the personal and religious life of Charles Nichols, Arthur Howard Nichols'

great uncle. Other personal documents that add insight into the interests and activities of Arthur Howard Nichols are located in Series V. These include Arthur's medical society programs, dinner club menus, political papers, and passenger lists from his travels to Europe.

While the collection offers a great deal of detailed information on the personal and financial lives of the Nichols family, as well as the professional life of Arthur Howard Nichols, papers documenting the professional life of Rose Standish Nichols are largely absent. Many letters pertain to her activism and her social life, but there is a dearth of material on her career as a garden designer.

Primarily an account of a tour of Europe during the spring and summer of 1868. Nichols visits Ireland, England, Belgium, Amsterdam, Germany, France, Switzerland, and Scotland. Includes descriptions of sights, particularly churches, and church services. The volume begins with diary entries from 1862-1865, consisting mostly of religious rhetoric. There is a brief account of his trip to Rome in 1872, which he notes was "a failure," having been "broken up" by his traveling companion. Nichols notes in an 1879 entry that he always wanted to return to Europe a third time, but likely never will. The volume concludes with astronomical calculations and notes on the centennial table, dated 1883; undated notes on votes for the presidential election of 1868; an undated passage entitled "Our Pedagree;" undated notes on trips taken in 1836 and 1863; and a list of deaths occurring between 1836 and 1872.

Vol. 16 Commonplace book and calendar, 1877-1880

Commonplace book likely by C. M. Ide. Two inscriptions indicate Ide wrote from Homberg, Germany and Nice, France, 1877. Writing includes musings on religion, love, grief, poetry, nature, God, and historical events. The author quotes extensively from Shakespeare, the Bible, Hans Christian Anderson, John Milton, Florence Nightengale, Aristotle, Cicero, Francis Bacon, Lord George G. Byron, and others. There are two poems by Ernest W. Shurtleff,² one of which is dated

Aug. 1879 with the inscription "prize poem, Boston Latin School / 17 years of age." There is an 1880 calendar pasted in the center of the book with notes detailing travel between Nice and Homburg. The calendar was purportedly kept by Arthur Howard Nichols.

ACQUISITION NOTE

The Nichols House Museum acquired this collection through a combination of Rose Standish Nichols' 1960 bequest and subsequent gifts by her family and friends. However, information on the gift accessions was incomplete and the collection processor was unable to rely on this information when preparing the manuscripts for processing and formulating an arrangement of the collection. Therefore, all of the manuscript material found in the Nichols House Museum in the fall of 2007 was merged into a single collection, unified by the common Nichols family provenance, and arranged with as much respect to original order as possible.
